Ed Gandy – Jamesburg Elks – Mr. Gandy spoke on behalf of the Elks Lodge. The lodge has been shut down since March due to COVID 19. They have no income coming in. They will be holding their annual trunk raffle in October and will be having a pick up only rib night to try to bring money into the lodge.

The Elks has been denied outside seating behind the lodge due to the close proximity of a resident. They are requesting to have that decision overturned.

Mayor Lowande, Chief Craparotta and several Councilmembers stated they are willing to work with the Elks to get them outdoor seating. The seating will not be allowed in the back of their building. The Borough is willing to approve an outdoor seating area in the front of the building. The tables and seats would be limited. Food must be served, limited times, no big parties.

It was decided the decision could be made administratively. This would save time not having to wait until the next council meeting to have it approved.

Randy Dey – 9 Woodland Road – Mr. Dey is a lifelong resident of Jamesburg. He has addressed the Mayor and Council about his neighborhood always smelling like fire. Mayor Lowande explained the Borough is working on a fire Ordinance that will be ready for the September council meeting.

COUNCILMATIC COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- FINANCE COMMITTEE
Council Member Rampacek

Councilmember Rampacek reported:

Finance Report – Our audit has been completed and it went well, there were no comments. Since Scott just received this audit on Monday, we will be approving it at our next month’s meeting. Also, body cameras were purchased for the police department. These cameras cost \$14,476.00 and the money came from Capital, Police and Dispatch budgets.

Library Report –. The library’s website underwent an overhaul and the new version is up and running. This new website is more user friendly and also is compatible on smartphones. Right now, the library is still doing curbside pickup, but are hoping to open their doors within the next few weeks. They are following CDC guidelines and taking as many precautions as possible to make the environment safe for their patrons. There will be only a limited number of people allowed in at one time and they are working on ways to sanitize the building, books, and computers. Also, as of August 15th, the library is offering curbside printing services. Anyone interested in this service can call the library at 732-521-0440 to schedule a pickup appointment. Once the time is scheduled you can send the documents you need printed to jamesburglibrarynews@gmail.com and they will be ready for you to pick up during your allotted time.

Public Events – No public events to report, however, Councilmember Rampacek asked if the town can create a registry of elderly or residents on oxygen that may need additional help during a storm or power outage. Mayor Lowande responded with the OEM is working on one. Also, during non-COVID times Borough Hall would be open to help residents.

- EDUCATION COMMITTEE
Council Member Shaughnessy

Councilmember Shaughnessy reported Jamesburg Public Schools will open virtually on September 8th. The decision was announced this week in a letter from Interim Superintendent Dennis Fillippone. Teachers will be in the school buildings, teaching virtually from their physical classrooms 3-4 days a week. Self-contained Special Education students will be in school physically 4 days a week. All other students will have 5 days of virtual instruction.

When it is possible, after signage has been installed, ventilation systems have been retrofitted, and temporary staff hired. The schools will start to bring the students into the building according to the hybrid model presented in July by the Board of Education meeting. The return is expected to be phased-in starting with Pre-K. It is unlikely that the hybrid model is implemented for all students in both schools before November 1st.

Virtual learning will be improved. The district is providing all students with Chromebooks, and teachers will be trained in new remote learning digital tools, Social Emotional Learning methods, and safety strategies for 3 days at the start of September, and during afternoons after virtual learning lessons have ended.

A letter will be sent out this week to parents informing them of which cohort their student is assigned to. Cohorts will determine which day parents will go to the school to pick up their student's district issued Chromebooks and textbooks for virtual learning. Cohorts will also determine which days students attend school once the hybrid model is put into effect.

Food distribution will continue for families qualifying for free and reduced lunch. For all others, the district will provide breakfast and lunch at cost. Please attend tomorrow night's virtual School Board Meeting. The plan will be presented in full, and the superintendent will answer any questions the public has.

- POLICE COMMITTEE
Council Member Sussman

Councilmember Sussman reported body cameras have been purchased. When we started looking at them, we were quoted \$100M- \$200M. We were able to get them for \$14,476.00. Police are using the and doing well. We were able to use \$5,000 from the

savings we had on purchasing a new vehicle. School will be starting during COVID and with a new superintendent. It seems they have everything well planned out.

Councilmember Rutaky understands the cameras were a necessity because of the times we are living in but asked if we could get a grant to supplement some of the cost. Administrator Frueh will submit it to the CARES Act.

Ed Gandy from the Elks Lodge explained the Elks may be able to help out with the body cameras. They saved some money this year on the 8th grade dance. He will see what he can do.

- PERSONNEL COMMITTEE
Council President Czarneski

Council President Czarneski reported due to COVID 19 the Borough Personnel continue to work in staggered shifts to ensure minimal contact while in the office. I got a preview of the body cameras and am on board with them.

- PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE
Council Member Rutsky

Councilmember Rutsky reported the 8th grade graduation was beautiful. It was held outside in front of the rain garden. I would like to thank the DPW for all their hard work during the pandemic. During the very hot and unpredictable weather of July and August, Paul Intravartolo our supervisor, and his crew of three managed to maintain the recycling yard, downtown area, clear sewers when needed and when asked to clean up debris for residents after the storm they rose to the call as they do whenever an unpredictable need is required. This of course put their regular maintenance of equipment on hold. Grass cutting needed to be delayed. The pump station needed to be manned for several days with a generator until electricity was restored after the storm. Several large trees needed to be removed from roadways, but not before electrical wires were repaired. Tree removal for two men without up to date equipment made the job extremely tough. Due to scheduling of a homerun derby one man was asked to leave tree removal to cut Green Acres. At this point the grass was very high and would need to be cut twice due to all the other tasks at hand. When tree removal was complete and assistance was available at the park, there was only one lawnmower to be used. We are down to one lawnmower for the rest of the season and have hopes to include at least two in next year's budget. The remaining one is 11 years old and the one that is broken can no longer be repaired. Again, I would like to thank our DPW for their commitment to the town, and for their scheduling and mechanical skills that keep the maintenance of our town moving forward.

Councilmmber Rutsky asked Administrator Frueh if we could purchase a 2nd lawnmower this year to get us through, Unfortunately, it is not in this year's budget. Councilmember

Shaughnessy asked if there were any FEMA funds that could help the DPW. Administrator Frueh said we do have some funds we could use this year towards repairs.

- ENVIRONMENT/ GREEN COMMITTEE:
Council Member Ludas

Councilmember Ludas reported the rain Garden at GMB School has been successfully completed. It looks great and provided for a great backdrop for the 8th grade graduation last Friday. The only downfall is the deer ate some of the plants at the rain garden. The good news is that Rutgers will replace them.

The Herb Garden is coming along nicely. We will give it until the end of September. There are now 3 participating restaurants, each receives herbs every other week.

- ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT
Scott Frueh

Administrator Frueh reported tax appeals were all won by the town. The tax rate will stay the same.

- PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE / RECREATION / COMMUNITY EVENTS:
